Author:

Written by Amos. Amos was a farmer from Tekoa in Judah (the Southern Kingdom) who prophecies to Israel (the Northern Kingdom).

Occasion and Purpose:

The increased prosperity of the Northern Kingdom brought increasing decadence and idolatry. The rich and powerful were taking advantage of the poor and weak. This is a symptom of the deeper issue of idolatry. Amos calls Israel to repentance and warns of judgment.

Themes:

1. Biblical Justice
2. No Ritual without Reality

Summary:

Warnings to Israel that her future contained only judgment unless she repented of her sins. Amos speaks out against spiritual sins and sins of injustice and oppression.
