to carry out an obligation of a moral or social nature, do, keep, carry out, practice, commit, cf. v. 21, 26
to do or perform, to do, to act, to carry out, to accomplish, to perform, doing, performance

ὁμοιωθήσεται

FPI3sg

fr. ὁμοιωῶ

make like, make someone like a person or thing, passive – become like, be like someone, cf. v. 26
to be like or similar to something else, to be like, to resemble, to be similar to, cf. 13:24

φρονίμῳ

pertaining to understanding associated with insight and wisdom, sensible, thoughtful, prudent, wise
pertaining to understanding resulting from insight and wisdom, wise, wisely, with understanding, with insight, ‘everyone who hears these words of mine and obeys them is like one who has understanding’

ὠκοδόμησεν

AAI3sg

fr. οἰκοδομῶ

to construct a building, build, build, erect, ‘build the house on the rock’
to make or erect any kind of construction, to build, to construct, ‘will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock’

οἰκίαν

a structure used as a dwelling, house, literally as a building
a building or place where one dwells, house, home, dwelling, residence

ἐπὶ

marker of location or surface, answering the question, ‘where?’ on, upon, near a position on a surface of an object, whether vertical or horizontal, and in contact with the object, on, upon

πέτραν

bedrock or massive rock formations, rock as distinguished from stones, it forms a suitable foundation for the building of a house, cf. Lk. 6:48
bedrock (possibly covered with a thin layer of soil), rocky crags, in contrast with separate pieces of rock, rock, bedrock, ‘he is like a wise man who built his house on bedrock’

fr. καταβαινω

to move downward, come/go/climb down, of rain, fall, cf. v. 27

AAI3pl

fr. ἔρχομαι

river, stream, to be understood as the mountain torrents or winter torrents which arise in ravines after a heavy rain and carry everything before them

air in relatively rapid movement, but without specification as to the force of the movement, wind, blowing, to blow

προσέπεσαν AAI3pl fr. προσπιπτω
to move with force against something, fall upon, strike against, of the winds that ‘beat upon’ a house with great force’
to strike against some object, to strike against, to hit against, ‘the winds blew and struck against that house’

ἔπεσεν AAI3sg fr. πιπτω
to move with relative rapidity in a downward direction, fall, of something that, until recently, has been standing (upright) fall (down), fall to pieces, of things, especially structures, fall, fall to pieces, collapse, go down, of a house, fall(in) cf. v. 27
to suffer or experience destruction, to experience destruction, to be destroyed

τεθεμελίωτο PluPfPI3sg fr. θεμελιω
to provide a base for some material object or structure, lay a foundation, found, cf. Lk. 6:48
to construct a foundation, to lay a foundation, to found something upon, ‘and it did not fall, for it was founded upon rock’
