Title:

Nahum- after its author.

Author:

Nahum the Elkoshite. Nahum means “comfort”. Very little is known about Nahum.

Occasion and Purpose:

About two generations after Jonah (between 663 B.C. and 612 B.C. [when Nineveh was destroyed]) Nahum prophesied God’s coming destruction on Nineveh, just as Jonah had done. Though God relented of destroying Nineveh in Jonah’s time, Nahum is very clear that Nineveh would indeed be destroyed, and this will bring comfort to God’s people.

Theme:

1. Wrath against Nineveh

Summary:

Nahum speaks against the Assyrian city of Ninevah. He predicts her violent overthrow and destruction, bringing the punishment she deserved. God punishes the wicked and brings comfort to the righteous. The God of Israel is also the God who is sovereign over all nations and they must answer to him.
