

Rev. 5:1-14

1. And I saw a scroll in the right hand of the One sitting upon the throne, written inside and outside, sealed with seven seals.
2. And I saw a powerful angel, proclaiming in a loud voice “Who is worthy to open the scroll and to break its seals?” 3. And no one in heaven, neither on the earth, nor under the earth was able to open the scroll or even to see it. 4. And I wept intensely, because no one worthy was found to open the scroll, nor to see it.
5. And one of the elders said to me “Do not weep! Behold, the Lion from the tribe of Judah, the root of David has triumphed to open the scroll and its seven seals.”
6. I saw in the middle of the throne and the four living creatures, a lamb was standing as having been slaughtered, having seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven Spirits of God, sent out into all the earth. 7. And He went and took [the scroll] from the right hand of the One sitting upon the throne. 8. And when He took the scroll, the four living creatures and the 24 elders fell down before the Lamb. Each had a harp and golden bowls filled with incense, which are the prayers of the saints. 9. And they sang a new song, saying, “You are worthy to take the scroll and to open its seals, because You were slaughtered, and You purchased to God by Your blood [people] from every tribe and language and people and nation. 10. And You made them to be a kingdom and priests to our God. And they will rule upon the earth.”
11. And I looked, and I heard the sound of many angels around the throne, and of the living creatures and of the elders (And their number was an uncountable number of uncountable numbers, and thousands of thousands), 12. saying with a loud voice, “The slaughtered Lamb is worthy to receive the power and riches, and wisdom, and strength, and honor, and glory, and blessing.” 13. And I heard all creation which is in heaven, and on the earth, and under the earth, and upon the sea, and everything in them, saying, “To the One sitting upon the throne and to the Lamb, be the blessing and the honor, and the glory, and the power, forever and ever.” 14. And the four living creatures said “Amen.” And the elders fell down and they worshipped.
